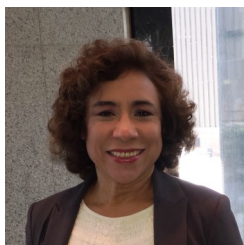


National Petroleum Energy Credit News Spring 2016

NPECA Strategy Update

Last fall we communicated to you that a NPECA Strategy Task Force was formed and held its first strategy session in August for the 2015-2017 strategic plan. During that session, the team developed NPECA's new mission statement and six primary objectives which were approved by the Board of Directors and assigned owners to each of the six objectives identified.

Mission Statement: To provide excellence in education and relevant networking opportunities for Credit and Payments professionals in the energy sector.

Objectives:

1. **Membership:** To enhance the relevance and value while growing the membership in the association.
2. **Education:** Equip members of NPECA with knowledge necessary to maximize area of expertise of trends, regulations and best practices in their profession.
3. **Leadership Development:** Strengthen the association through informed and engaged leaders.
4. **Communication:** Communicating value and relevance through branding.
5. **Financial Solvency:** Develop process and systems to protect financial integrity and growth of NPECA.
6. **Governance:** Enhance the efficiency and effectiveness of NPECA with an engaged and knowledgeable governing body and efficient operation

The consensus was to start our work immediately with the Governance Task Force which was tasked with: reviewing the governance structure, committee function, Board of Directors and Officers responsibilities, terms, and

leadership progression path.

The Governance Task Force has been working since September and submitted its recommendation for an updated organizational hierarchy to establish committee accountability, engage Board Members and define a clear leadership path for future NPECA leadership.

The NPECA Board of Directors has reviewed the work in progress and on December 11, 2015 it approved the simplified structure proposed and on January 28, 2016 approved the changes to the by-laws to reflect the strategic objectives. The work will now be submitted to the By-Law Committee for further processing.

Once the By-Laws are updated and approved by the Board in mid-March, they will be presented to the membership for approval via vote prior to the Annual Conference.

Other initiatives associated with the strategy are the redesign of the website, the development (in progress) of a formalized sponsorship program, the focus on education and financial solvency.

Your feedback is very important and we encourage each member to let us what you think, especially if you agree or disagree that we (your NPECA Board) are heading in the right direction towards achieving our objectives.

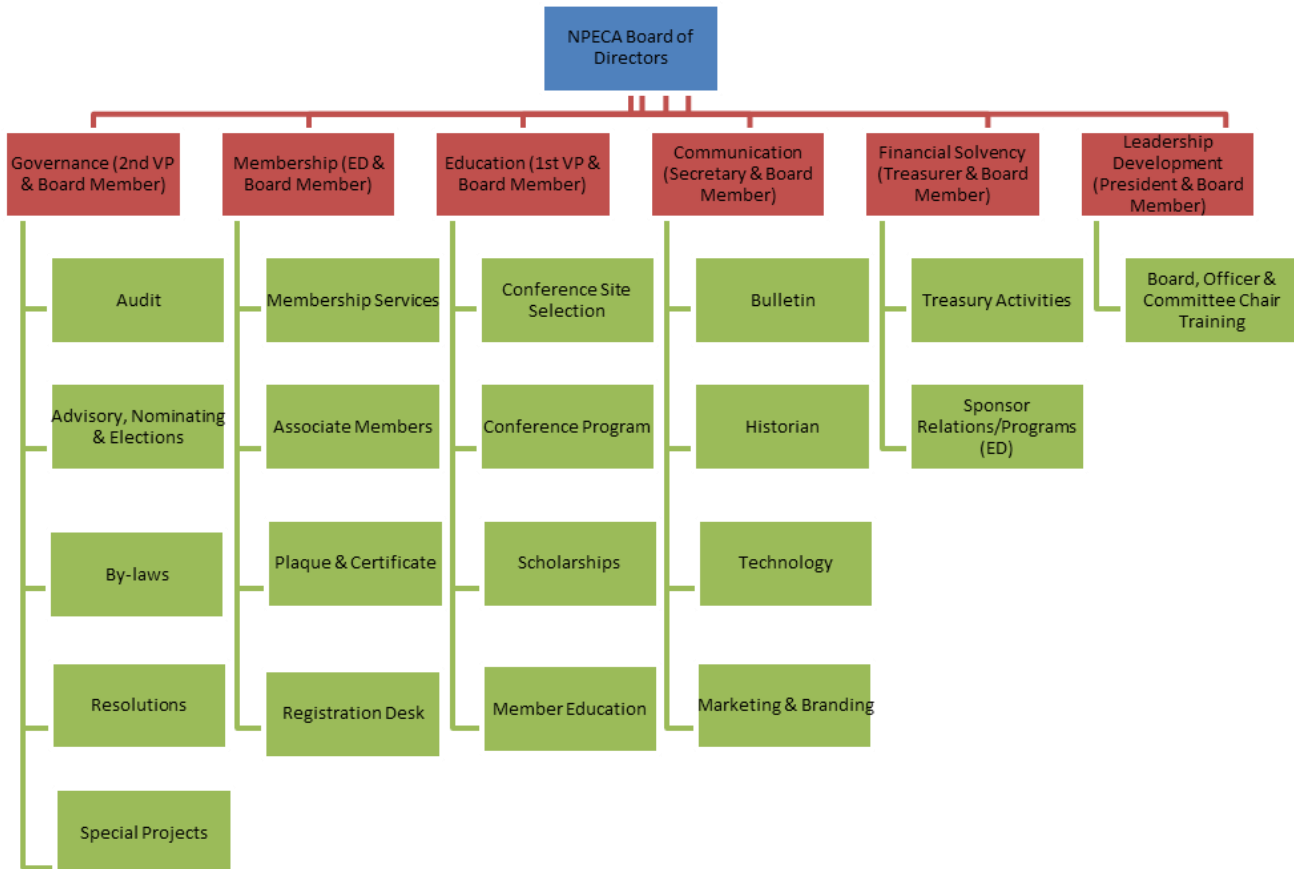

Proposed Board Structure & Terms

- ◆ Board of Directors—Seven
 - * One honorary member (past president) with a one year term
 - * Six regular board members
 - ◇ Prior committee chair experience or solid volunteer record or industry experience
 - ◇ Change Terms to either 2 or 3 years
 - Two years for progression into an Officer position
 - Three years for those who do not want to progress to Officer
- ◆ Officers – Five
 - * Eliminate Third VP
 - * Each position is a one year term (to be consistent with leadership progression)
 - * Progression: Board, Secretary, Treasurer, 2nd VP, 1st VP, President
 - ◇ Transition to new leadership team at Annual Conference

Technology

The responsive website redesign mentioned in the fall 2015 newsletter is now complete. This will provide an improved user experience for direct access to the website from any screen or device. The website and phone app include a “join us” button to attract and register new members. The phone app now includes an event menu to view the conference agenda, send e-mail reminders or to e-mail conference details on the fly.

The look and feel of the website is clean and fresh. We improved the website menu for ease of navigation. Finally, the redesign updated the look and feel of some back office tools although the basic functions remain the same. The newest item for this year is using the event management software for conference registration instead of using CVENT. This will save the association several thousand dollars per year going forward.

Archive folders are now set-up for each committee to house meeting notes, graphs, charts, templates, spreadsheets, surveys, and minutes for conduction association business. Comments or suggestions for additional improvements are always welcome.

Education

Every year the NPECA awards four \$1,000 scholarships and a \$1,500 Jerry Dean Memorial Scholarship. To be considered eligible for the scholarship, candidates must be a dependent of an active Regular or Honorary NPECA member. The member must have maintained their membership in the NPECA a minimum of one year prior to the candidates’ application. Scholarship applicants must be accepted or enrolled in an accredited college and carry at least 12 hours of college credit per semester. Applicants must also have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher. Those candidates meeting the above requirements and are pursuing a post graduate degree are also eligible. If a candidate has received or are expected to receive scholarships or grants which will substantially underwrite the costs of their continuing education over the award year are considered ineligible. A member may have multiple dependents apply and each may be awarded a scholarship.
